- Myths tell stories about what it means to be human and how to survive as a human
- Mythic archetypes express as symbols and symbol systems
- The study of a set of stories, beliefs, or traditions associated with a specific group or groups of people
- Myths generally take place in a primordial world or 'Golden Age' prior to the contemporary world takes form
- Frequently myth is a sacred narrative that explains how the present world came into being
- The mythic world is populated by gods and goddesses, supernatural beings, heroes and humans
- Myths explain how certain traditions, customs and taboos originated
- The Greek Mythographer
  Euhemerus, who lived in the late 4<sup>th</sup>
  century B.C., was the first person to
  suggest that myths might be an
  actual recounting of historic events,
  embellished upon by repeated
  retelling
- Euhemerus forged a new method of interpretation of contemporary religious beliefs

## **Archetypes**

- An Archetype is a commonly inherited primordial symbol universally recognized by all
- In psychology, an archetype is a model of a person, personality, or behavior
- Dynamic, creative forces underlying all existence
- Present in folklore and mythology, archetypes are recognizable and typical patterns of behavior with certain probable outcomes
- Symbolic stories in myths and legends explore abstract concepts such as heroism, justice, love, mercy, truth, and wisdom
- Archetypes are primordial symbols in consciousness often portrayed as men or women
- Some examples of Archetypes are:
- Mother, seductress, imprisoned princess, witch, mediator, benevolent ruler, gallant hero, warrior, just lawgiver, martyred hero, dragon, trickster, shadow, shape-shifter, deceiver, lord of mis-rule

## GEMINI—1st Decanate (0 - 9°). Solar Dates: May 21 to May 31

- Symbols:  $\mathbb{I} \mathbb{I} (\S)$
- Constellation: Ursa Minor
- Description: A small bear which travels backwards, and whose long un-bearlike tail touches the pole star


- Keyword: Intuition
- Spiritual Text: "Only Through the Intuition Does Man Contact the Real Underlying Truth of Things."
- Ursa Minor is an easily-recognizable constellation more commonly called 'The Little Dipper'
- Alpha Ursae Minoris is more commonly called Polaris
- Polaris appears to be the one immovable point in the heavens, all other stars revolve around the celestial axis
- A second magnitude star, Polaris is not particularly bright and falls approximately 1° away from exact celestial north pole
- In Arabia, Polaris is known as 'the hole in which the axle of the earth is born
- In India, Polaris is known as 'Mt.
   Meru the seat of the gods'
- In Scandinavia it is 'the Throne of Thor
- The Greeks called this star 'Phonice' as the Phoenician navigators used this star
- Ursa Minor, the little bear has the Pole Star in the tip of its tail
- The tail of this bear is curiously unlike anything one might actually see on a bear
- Aratus called this constellation Cynosura or 'dog's tail' as the tail appears canine
- Legend holds that while the infant Zeus was hiding in the cave of Dicte on Crete he was nursed by two nymphs in the form of bears; Ida and Adrasteia
- Ursa Minor is Ida
- "By means of a bear— URSA MINOR—whose restless activity and power suggest that of the mind,

- the ancients depicted the Mercurydecanate of Gemini. And because the unconscious mind is not so obvious as the objective mind, this bear is small. So too, travels about the sky backward. Thus must one direct his attention contrary to the trend of objective life to hear "the voice of the silence." Perhaps unconsciously, yet none the less effectively, those born in the Gemini third of Gemini tend to rely upon intuition. Their natural field of endeavor is the mental plane. They see, not merely the details of a problem, but view it completely, perceiving the proper relation of each part to the whole. And if they are not carried away by the restless desire to undertake too many things, they may become intellectual giants. - Description: A large dog which sits up and watches closely for orders from his master, the hunter
- Keyword: Fidelity

## Canis Major $\mathbb{X} - \cong (\mathfrak{P})$


- Canis Major or 'Big Dog' contains the brightest star in the heavens, Sirius, the 'Dog Star'
- It is located at the foot of Orion between Lepus and Argo Navis
- Sirius is one of our closest neighbors, only 8.7 light years away
- It has a companion dwarf star that orbits it about every 50 years
- The name comes from the Greek meaning searing or scorching, thus we get the expression 'the dog days of summer'
- The heliacal rising of Sirius, that is the first day it can be seen before the rising of the Sun, timed the flooding of the Nile
- Around 3285 B.C. the heliacal rising of Sirius coincided with the Summer Solstice and the Egyptian New Year
- The 'Fidelity' decanate of Gemini, Canis Major is pictured at the feet of Orion and is described as a friendly dog, the welfare of his master in his heart
- He appears to be in pursuit of Lepus the hare
- Early astronomical authors identify this constellation with Laelaps a dog so fast that no prey could escape it
- Until it met the Theban Fox who was ravishing the countryside
- The Theban Fox was so fast that nothing could catch it

- You can imagine the paradox a dog so fast, nothing can escape it, and a fox so fast, nothing can catch it
- Zeus finally put them out of their misery by turning them to stone and placing Laelaps in the heavens, minus the pesky fox
- "The second decanate of Gemini is pictured in the sky by a large dog— CANIS MAJOR. This noble looking beast is the emblem of faithfulness, and through its adoration for its master also represents the worshiping and serving of Deity for to the dog his master is God. Therefore, we find those born under the second decanate of Gemini often possess a singular and admirable faithfulness, either to their human companions or to some high ideal. They have much veneration and seek to obey the voice of their conscience implicitly.

- Description: A huge bear that travels about the pole, but does not touch the pole star
- Keyword: Reason
- Spiritual Text: "Reason Points the Way to Truth, and Offers a Valuable

- Means by Which the Accuracy of the Reports of the Psychic Senses Can be Tested."
- Ursa Major, the 'Big Bear' is alternately known as the Big Dipper, plow, and wagon
- The seven stars that for the tail and back of Ursa Major are among the most commonly recognized stars
- These stars assist in finding the not very bright Pole Star
- If one draws an imaginary line between the stars Merak and Dubbe which form the end of the dipper, they point to Polaris, the star in the tail of Ursa Minor
- The Phoenicians, a sea-faring people, like the Greeks, used the bears for navigation
- Aratos, in his Phaenomena states;
   "The Greeks place faith in Helice (Ursa Major) in respect of their naval affairs and the direction of their shipping. The Phoenicians have confidence in Cynosure (Ursa Minor) during their voyages."
- Arctos, from which we get the word Arctic is Greek for bear
- Just as the two bears circle the Pole Star, it was believed that bears came from the north
- "A huge bear—URSA MAJOR—
  traveling about the pole-star in a
  forward direction depicts among the
  constellations the Aquarius-decanate
  of Gemini. The bear, whose restless
  activity and omnivorous nature is
  typical of mentality, in this case
  moves as does the objective mind, in
  the direction of events. And it is
  huge in size to indicate the immense
  power that may be exercised by
  thought. This is the scientific
