## The Mystery Schools

- The Egyptians believed that in order to separate humans from the beasts, all the arts and sciences, including but not limited to language, writing, agriculture, astrology, alchemy and ritual were given to mankind by their god Thoth.
- When the Greeks conquered Egypt in 332 B.C. they began the long process of absorbing Egyptian culture and learning. The Greeks syncretized the Egyptian deity Thoth with their god Hermes (known in Latin as Mercury).
- Thoth, the giver of learning, became Hermes Trismegistus, or Thrice-Greatest Hermes. The body of knowledge that he bequeathed to mankind which included alchemy, astrology and magic are called the Hermetic sciences in his honor.
- The wealthy classes of the Greek world sent their sons to be educated in the Hermetic Mystery Schools
- The Asclepius, the Corpus
  Hermeticum, the Divine Pymander
  and the Emerald Tablet are works
  that were all attributed to Hermes
  Trismegistus.
- These writings along with half a million other volumes of the collected knowledge of their day, were housed in the Ancient Library of Alexandria, now shrouded in myth. In its heyday the library was the center of scholarship in the pre-Christian world.

- In the late 18<sup>th</sup> century a manuscript was being circulated in Europe that was attributed to Iamblicus, the 3<sup>rd</sup> century AD neoplatonic philosopher
- It described in detail the ritual of Egyptian Initiation
- In the 19<sup>th</sup> century it was translated into French by Paul Christian
- Zain uses Genevieve Stebbins
   English translation in the Sacred
   Tarot
- It describes the 22 major Arcanum of the tarot as icons on the steps of initiation
- "Candidates aspiring to membership in the religious orders underwent severe tests to prove their worthiness. These ordeals were called initiations. Those who passed them successfully were welcomed as brothers by the priests and were instructed in the secret teachings. Among the ancients, philosophy, science, and religion were never considered as separate units: each was regarded as an integral part of the whole. Philosophy was scientific and religious; science was philosophic and religious; religion was philosophic and scientific. Perfect wisdom was considered unattainable save as the result of harmonizing all three of these expressions of mental and moral activity."

## The Cycle of Necessity

- At the core of The Brotherhood of Light Mystery School tradition is the Hermetic creation story, called "The Cycle of Necessity"
- It describes the Soul's journey into matter in order to grow in Love and Wisdom (compassion and knowledge)
- The ultimate goal of Hermeticism is "Self-conscious Immortality" to be self-aware in a state of mystical union with the Divine
- The Cycle of Necessity describes the Soul's involution into matter and evolution back to spirit.
- The ego, or spark of divinity in us all, is born to angelic parents in the highest level of the spiritual realms.
- Around the ego twin souls develop which are impelled on a cyclic journey in order to develop the characteristics, skills and abilities that allow them to fulfill their role as in God's Great Plan.

### **Shuffling Cards**

- "While the mind is so occupied, the cards should be shuffled in such a manner as not merely to rearrange them in the deck, but to reverse the ends of some. They should then be cut into three piles and gathered again into a pack. This shuffling and cutting should be repeated three times; and then the cards dealt, face downward. They are turned over from top to bottom, but turned over only one at a time, as read."

- "One who has experience with the tarot cards will become convinced

that there is some power present, not merely that directs how they shall be read, but that actually directs their distribution so that they will give a correct reading. Extra-sensory perception is able to observe their positions in the pack as shuffled. And extra-physical power (now demonstrated in our universities as the Psychokinetic Effect) in cooperation with the unconscious muscular activities of the shuffler, tends to arrange the cards in shuffling, and so to cut the pack, that when dealt they shall fall in positions to give the information desired."

# Giving a Reading
